The center is home to the Policy Design Studio and supports multiple international research initiatives.

- The Policy Design Studio provides evidence-based training and analysis on policy design, the engagement of government and non-governmental stakeholders in policy formulation, and policy implementation.
- The Computational Institutional Science Lab is an international hub for developing and applying computational methods to study how societies are governed.
- The Institutional Grammar Research Initiative convenes scholars from around the world who study and practice institutional analysis.
- The center is also the institutional host to the Policy Studies Journal, the leading policy process field journal and the #4 journal in the field of public administration.

2024 CONFERENCE ON POLICY PROCESS RESEARCH

The Center for Policy Design and Governance hosted the 2024 Conference on Policy Process Research (COPPR24) May 15-17 on the Syracuse University campus.

COPPR24 featured 71 panels and 8 roundtables that focused on advancing the scholarship of policy process theory and methods. The conference had 373 registered participants (250 in-person and 123 virtual) representing over 180 institutions and 30 countries.
